JULY 7, 2020 - 6:00 PM

The council gave the option to meet via Zoom or in the council chambers due to the Governor's State of Public Health Disaster, eliminating groups of more than 50% capacity and social distancing.

Eldora City Council met in Special Session with Mayor David Dunn presiding. Council members Cindy Johns, Melody Hoy, Blake Jones, Aaron Budweg, Greg Priske and Mayor David Dunn were present. Aaron, Greg, Cindy, David, and Chandra were present in the council chambers and Melody and Blake were on Zoom. Also, present by Zoom or in person were citizens, department heads and newspaper reporters.

The meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor David Dunn opened the citizens comment period and John Schmitz spoke.

The Mayor introduced Resolution 07-20-2892, Resolution setting the fiscal year 20-21 salaries and wages for the

City of Eldora employees. The City has reached a Union Contract for the next year and the raise will be 2.75% for full-time and permanent part-time union and non-union employees that have been with the City for at least 6 months. The part-time employees received less than the 2.75% at the department head recommendation. Council member Hoy motioned, seconded by Priske to approve Resolution 07-20-2892. Roll call vote: "ayes": Priske, Johns and Hoy; "nays": Budweg; absent: none; "abstain": Blake. Motion carried. Blake abstained since he works part-time for the police department.

The council discussed Resolution 07-20-2890, Resolution approving temporary pay increase for Anthony Schrad for added duties as acting Police Chief. The City Administrator can grant a temporary pay increase for added duties and the council agreed the Mayor was the acting City Administrator. This resolution would not be needed, and the Mayor will be giving Anthony Schrad an 8% increase for added duties while the Police Chief is on personal leave.

Last was the Purchase Policy and Conflict of Interest Policy. Both policies were needed before the City can apply for a FEMA grant. The policies set the dollar limit required for a bid process and how the bid process is done. Council member Budweg motioned, seconded by Priske to approve the Purchase Policy. Roll call vote: "ayes": Budweg, Priske, Jones, Johns and Hoy; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried. Council member Budweg motioned, seconded by Hoy to approve the Conflict of Interest Policy. Roll call vote: "ayes": Budweg, Hoy, Jones, Priske and Johns; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried.

Motion carried.

The Greenbelt Home Care (GHC) lease will be discussed at the GHC board meeting on July 13th and will be on the July 14th council meeting. The Union Contract members will have another meeting on July 1st, so the Union Contract and Resolution 06-20-2892 on wages will be approved later in July.

The council discussed Resolution 06-28-2889, Resolution establishing street closing for Pine Lake Festival Motorcycle Show at Memorial Park. The council moved the street closing area from just south of the restroom and going north to 9th Avenue. This way leaving parking for those who would like to visit the park, Welcome Center or Vet Memorial. Council member Budweg motioned, seconded by Priske to approve Resolution 06-20-2889. Roll call vote: "ayes": Priske, Johns and Jones; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried.

The meeting was called to order at 5:15 p.m. by President Maggie VanderWilt with the reading of the mission statement "Embracing today's challenges, preparing for tomorrow's world."

Discusses/Action Consent Agenda Motion by Emily Herring seconded by Nick LaVelle to approve the consent agenda. All voted in favor. The motion carried. Included in the consent agenda along with the agenda, June regular meeting minutes, report of disbursements, and financial report were the following items: an open enrollment request for Alexis Brekke from BCLUW to ENP for HSAP; staff recommendations for Penelope Klimesh as high school special ed para and Amber Smitherman as elementary special ed para; 2020-21 Universal Pediatrics Service Agreement for Nursing Services; 2020-21 Agreement for Sharing Level 3 BD Program with Iowa Falls CSD; 2020-21 Drake Clinical Learning Affiliation Agreement; and a Dashir Management Addendum B - Addition of HS Full time night custodian.

Public Report Time - Dr. Zellmer read a comment from ENP Parent Julie Roe stating she has concerns for students and staff, however she feels students need to return to school for the education they did not get last year. She noted she would prefer masks be optional and everyone should be allowed to wear a mask if they choose. Discuss/Action 2020-21 Return to Learn Plan Dr. Zellmer noted this is a 2 part process - 1st approving the required Department of Education Return to Learn Plan which was a list of check boxes, then discussing scenarios for Return to Opening up our schools for the fall. Motion by Emily Herring seconded by Jay Stanish to approve the Iowa Department of Education Return to Learn Plan. All voted in favor. The motion carried. The board discussed the return to the opening of school and what that could look like. A timeline was established with a Draft Plan released on July 31st and a Special Joint Board Meeting on August 4th to tweak and approve the plan. Online School Registration will begin August 7th and School is set to begin on August 24th. Discuss/Action 2021 IASB Legislative Priorities Dr. Zellmer informed the board that each year IASB asks Districts to weigh-in on the Legislative Priorities for the upcoming Legislative Session. The board then worked to come up with a consensus on 4 priorities to send forward to IASB from the ENP School District. Motion by Jay Stanish seconded by Jared Cook to approve the following Legislative Priorities for the 2021 Iowa Legislative Session:

- #4 Early Literacy, #7 Mental Health, #18 School Finance Funding, and #29 Sharing and Reorganization. All voted in favor. The motion carried. Discuss/Action Purchase of John Deere Utility Tractor Dr. Zellmer reminded the board he had asked for approval of purchasing the John Deer Utility Tractor in late June and is now requesting formal approval. Motion by Marc Anderson seconded by Nick LaVelle to approve the purchase of the John Deere Utility Tractor and Accessories from Jeff Henning for \$16,000. All voted in favor. The motion carried. Administrator/Supervisor/Superintendent Comments Dr. Zellmer noted he had been working on the return to learn plan then taken 9 days off to regroup. He stated the principals were taking some time off and he planned to pull the group back together next week to focus on our return to learn plan and return to opening up our schools for fall. Set Date and Time of Next Regular Meeting The next regular board meeting will be on Monday, August 10th at 5:15 p.m. in the District Office and how to participate will be determined by government regulations at the time of agenda posting. We will have a special meeting on August 4th in the High School Auditorium. Closed Session - Section 21.5(1.i) Superintendent Evaluation Motion by Jared Cook seconded by Jay Stanish to enter into Closed Session for the purpose of conducting the Superintendent Evaluation as allowed by Iowa Code 21.5(1.i). Roll call vote: Ayes: Stanish, Herring, LaVelle, Anderson, Cook, VanderWilt, and Salvo. Nays: None. The motion carried. Motion by Jared Cook seconded by Jay Stanish to return to Open Session.
