Eldora City Council met in Special Session with Mayor David Dunn pre-siding. Council members Cindy Johns, Melody Hoy, Blake Jones, Aaron Budweg, Greg Priske and Mayor David Dunn were present. Aaron, Greg, Cindy, David and Chandra were present in the council chambers and Melody and Blake were on Zoom. Also, present by Zoom or in person were citizens, department heads and newspaper reporters.

The meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Mayor asked for a motion to open the public hearing on the City Budget Amendment and Council member Johns so moved, seconded by Priske. Roll call vote: "ayes": Budweg, Priske, Jones, Johns and Hoy; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried. The public hearing opened at 6:03 pm. There were no public comments and the Mayor asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Council member Budweg so moved, seconded by Hoy. Roll call vote: "ayes":

Jones, Johns, Priske, Hoy and Budweg; "navs": none: absent: none. Motion carried. The public hearing closed at 6:05 pm.

Mayor David Dunn asked for a motion to accept the consent agenda. Council member Johns motioned, seconded by Priske to approve the consent agenda. The consent agenda approved consisted of the fiscal year end claims, refuse permit for Green RU LLC, Stone Sanitation and Knights Sanitation and the tree trimming permit for Affordable Tree Service. The meeting was called to order at 5:15 p.m. by President Maggie Vander-Wilt with the reading of the mission statement "Embracing today's challenges, preparing for tomorrow's world. Discuss/Action Consent Agenda

The board discussed the return to the opening of school and what that could look like timeline was established with a Draft Plan released on July 31st and a Special Joint Board Meeting on August 4th to tweak and approve the plan.
