ORDINANCE NO. 868 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 41 OF THE ELDORA MUNICPAL CODE

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council for the city of Eldora, Iowa: Section 1. Purpose: The purpose of this ordinance is to amend portions of current Chapter 41 by deleting current

section 41.11(3) (A) through (H) and substituting in lieu thereof the following: 41.11(3) (A) **Definitions**. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, ex-

cept where the context clearly indicates a different meaning: "Consumer fireworks" means first-

class consumer fireworks and secondclass consumer fireworks as those terms are defined in this subsection.

"Display fireworks" means any ex plosive composition, or combination of explosive substances, or article prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation, and includes fireworks containing any explosive or flammable compound, or other device containing any explosive substance. The term "display fireworks" does not include novelties or consumer fireworks enumerated in chapter 3 of the American Pvrotechnics Association (APA) standard 87-

"First-class consumer fireworks means the following consumer fireworks, as described in APA standard 87-1, chapter 3

(1) Aerial shell kits and reloadable tubes.

(2) Chasers.

(3) Helicopter and aerial spinners.

- (4) Firecrackers.(5) Mine and shell devices.
- (6) Missile-type rockets (7) Roman candles.
- (8) Sky rockets and bottle rockets.

der this definition that are manufactured in accordance with APA standard 87-1, section 3.5

"Novelties" means all novelties, enu-merated in chapter 3 of the APA standard 87-1, and that comply with the labeling regulations promulgated by the United States consumer product safety commission. The term "novelties" includes party poppers, snappers, toy smoke devices, snakes and glow worms, and wire sparklers as defined in APA standard 87-1, section 3.2.

"Second-class consumer fireworks" means the following consumer fireworks, as described in APA standard 87-1, chapter 3:

(1) Cone fountains

(2) Cylindrical fountains.

(3) Flitter sparklers.

(4) Ground and handheld sparkling devices, including multiple tube ground and handheld sparkling devices that are manufactured in accordance with APA standard 87-1, section 3.5. (5) Ground spinners.

(6) Illuminating torches.

(7) Toy smoke devices that are not classified as novelties pursuant to APA standard 87-1, section 3.2. (8) Wheels

(9) Wire or dipped sparklers that are not classified as novelties pursuant to APA standard 87-1, section 3.2.

B. Prohibitions. The use or exploding of consumer fireworks or display fireworks within the city limits is prohibited, unless a permit is properly obtained as set forth in subsection (C) of this section. A violation of this section constitutes a municipal infraction and may be enforced according to the provisions of Chapter 4 of this Ordinance.

C. Tenant. No tenant, party in possession or landlord shall permit, allow or engage in the use of explosion of consumer fireworks

D. Permits. The City may, upon written application, grant a permit for the display of fireworks on private or public property by a City agency, fair associations, amusement parks, individual and other organizations or groups of individuals approved by City authorities when such fireworks display will be handled by a competent operator. The City may impose such restrictions on the permit as are necessary for public safety and welfare. The permit fee shall be set by resolution of the council. No permit is required for the displaying of novelties.

Section 2. Effect. All other Sections of said Chapter shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

Section 3. Severability. If any secsubsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause or phrase of the Code is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unenforceable as to any person or circumstances, the application of such section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause or phrase to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it shall be held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby. an all other provisions of the Code, in all other respects, shall be and remain valid and enforceable

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance and the Eldora Municipal Code shall be in full force and shall take effect, from and after the adoption a publication of this ordinance.

STEAMBOAT ROCK CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL SESSION JULY 27, 2020

The Steamboat Rock City Council met in special session July 27th, 2020, 6:30 p.m. with City Council in chambers and available via zoom due to COVID-19 restrictions. Present were Mayor Stearns and the following council members: Adam Blackburn, Jackie Hagberg, Wren Hoffman, Kevin Pieters and Cory Schurman; absent: none. Also present were JJ Veld, Melissa Johanson, Suzie Devries, Sondra & Tracy Morlan, Randall Shores, Jerry Hoffman, City Attorney Taylor Nederhoff and Renee Oltrogge.

Mayor Stearns called the meeting to order. Blackburn moved, seconded by Hoffman to approve the posted agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

Mayor Stearns read aloud the Shores Property proposal as provided by City Attorney Taylor Nederhoff: At 6:45 pm Public hearing on the vacation and abandon ment of

It was discussed that the city will have an easement for any city owned items such as the road to the sewer plant. well for sewer plant, sewer lines to and from the sewer plant and anything of that nature. Mayor Stearns advised at our last council meeting it has been requested for the city to sell a portion of our river front property. Since that meeting a petition was posted from citizens of Steamboat Rock stating – Disposition of City owned River front property. The following citizens of the City of Steamboat Rock, Iowa request the Mayor and City Council present an ordinance to forbid the sale of any City owned river front property to private entities or individuals. In addition we request an ordinance forbidding any privately owned campgrounds/campsites within 500 yards of any residential property. The purpose of these ordinances is to protect the privacy and sanctity of the property and citizens in the area. It is to be a noise and nuisance deterrent to ensure the current peaceful natural environment of the inhabitants, both human and wildlife.

This petition was signed by 35 citiwith addresses with-in the city zens all limits of Steamboat Rock and represent greater than 10% of the population. Mayor Stearns presented the results of multiple discussions with the DNR and their recommendation we not sell or lease any river front property and City Attorney Taylor Nederhoff recommended we not lease any publicly owned property. Mayor Stearns also gave examples of Iowa communities that are reclaiming river front prop-erty for the public to enjoy. City Council gave Sondra Morlan permission to speak on the subject. Morlan wish to discuss the campground portion of the petition and Mayor Stearns explained this is a separate topic that will be discussed at a later meeting, we are just addressing the sale of publicly owned river front property at this meeting. Morlan is still requesting the city to sell them a 30 foot portion of river front property. All council members advised they wish to not sell any city owned river front property at this time. Hagberg moved, seconded by Hoffman to approve the motion to not sell city owned public river front property. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

The purchase of a snow plow truck was presented. A 2006 International for \$20,000 was inspected by some of the councilpersons. Schurman suggested we offer \$18,500. Pieters moved, seconded by Blackburn to approve the purchase of a snow plow truck. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

During the public comment period: Jerry Hoffman believes our city needs a master plan, vision for parks, river front and trails. Hoffman stated there are three counties growing due to available outdoor recreation. Hoffman believes the city should be collecting revenue for parking, gas, food trucks, etc as an important wheel in the cog to move forward. Hoffman sees people moving into town and buying property to use as rental and would rather see homeowners with pride of ownership. Hoffman would like to assist

with getting grants for parks. Pieters moved to adjourn the meeting, Hoffman seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none. Meeting adjourned at 7:09 pm
