### **Eldora City Council Regular** Council Meeting May 9, 2023 -- 6:00 pm

The council gave the option to meet via conference call, Zoom or at the Council Chamber.

Eldora City Council met in Reg-ular Session with Mayor David W Dunn presiding. Council members Carey Morton, Cindy Drake, Jerry Kramer, and Mike May Jr were present along with City Administrator Aaron Budweg, and Joyce Lawler. Gary Warmbier then spoke against the pipeline also indicating that if CO2 plume takes the oxygen out of the air and that he has spent a lot of money on his farm for tiling and they could just go through it

and damage the tiling.

Meghan Sloma spoke via Zoom against the pipeline also. From an attorney's view, she indicated that the pipeline will only be 4 foot underground and would work its way up mixing with soil. y not just where the pipeline would be. From a real estate agent's view, it will reduce land values. From a community advocate's view, the pipeline runs 2500 psi, gas lines have to have an additive so that a leak can be smelt

where this does not. Next item was discussion on the

property located at 1609 15th Avenue. Budweg indicated that he had moved the "For Sale" sign there and has had individuals contact him regarding it. Council indicated that he should pursue this and come back
